WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR THE FORMER RURAL DISTRICT OF HARTISMERE IN THE FORMER ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF EAST SUFFOLK

SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT (PARISHES OF BOTESDALE AND BURGATE - RUPP NOS. 7, 10, 29) (MODIFICATION) ORDER 1987

On 17 May 1988 the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed the above-named Orders.

The effect of the reclassification order is to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by reclassifying as byways open to all traffic the roads used as public paths leading from Buggs Road in the north to Stubbings Green in the south Nos. 7/29/10/29 in the Parishes of Botesdale and Burgate (also known in whole or in part as Scama Lane).

The effect of the modification order is to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area in respect of Scama Lane so that:

- (1) there is a common number of 50 for each length in both Parishes; and
- (2) the existing description is replaced by:

In the Parishes of Botesdale and Burgate: From Bugg's Road running along Scama Lane:

Firstly from Bugg's Road, of a width of 12 ft along the middle of the lane (measured by reference to the top of the western bank of the watercourse on the east side and the top of the eastern bank of the ditch on the west side), for a distance of approximately 340 metres to a point at OS grid reference TM 06937529 near the pond on the west side of the lane


and then running along the western side of the watercourse, of a width of 12 ft (measured by reference to the top of the western bank of the watercourse), for a distance of approximately 85 metres to a bridge across the watercourse at OS grid reference TM 06907522

and then from the bridge running along eastern side of the watercourse, of a width of 12 ft (measured by reference to the top of the eastern bank of the watercourse), for a distance of approximately 274 metres to the field boundary at OS grid reference TM 06887502.

In the Parish of Botesdale: From the field boundary at OS grid reference TM 06887502 running along the eastern side of the watercourse, of a width of 12 ft (measured by reference to the top of the eastern bank of the watercourse), for a distance of approximately 350 metres to a point on the parish boundary at OS grid reference TM 06757462.

In the Parish of Burgate: From a point on the parish boundary at OS grid reference TM 06757462 running along the eastern side of the watercourse, of a width of 12 ft (measured by reference to the top of the eastern bank of the watercourse), for a distance of approximately 420 metres to its junction with RUPP 28 (Burgate) and the unclassified road number 5428, the eastern end of Stubbings Green.

The purpose of the modification order is to provide a better definition of the position and width of the route.
