F.P.2	No name. It runs on the east side of the N/S fence and connects Ivy House Farm cart track with Sandy Lane (named Callow Hill Road in the 1818 Award) at the north end of Brown's Oitch.
F.P.3	Consists of (a) West Hern Lane, a green land being the 8th private road in the 1818 award; (b) a footpath, no name, being public footpath No.2 in the 1818 Award running from the north end of (a) along the north side of an east-west fence to the parish boundary with Hinderclay fen. An awarded path
F.P.5	A green lane, named Mill Lane, wide enough for farm vehicles connecting the Church Road with Fen Street, starting from between the Methodist Chapel and the council houses and running in a northerly direction to Fen Street. Described as the 5th private road in the 1818 award.
F.P.6	No name. Commences as a cart track continuing east from No. 4 to the south-east corner of Bushel's Pit and from there as a footpath to link up with No. 9 at the top of Honeypot Hill.
F.P.8	Connecting Church Road with Fen Street. Starting at the south-west corner of the field known as Clapper's Close, continuing along the east side of a succession of fences and crossing one meadow to the south and one meadow to the east of Fen Farm to finish at the junction of Fen Street and Bier Lane (No. 11).
F.P.9	Consists of Honey Pot Lane (the 4th private road in the 1818 Award) and a footpath (part of the 3rd public footpath of the 1818 Award) running eastwards on the north side of a fence shown on the map to join No. 8.
F.P.10	No name. A footpath running from the middle of No. 8 to the Church Road about 200 yards west of St. Mary's Church.
F.P.11	Bier Lane. A green lane from Fen Street proceeding in a south-easterly direction to Church Road east of St Mary's Church.
F.P.12	Running from the north-eastern corner of O.S. Field No. 4900 in a southerly direction along the eastern headland of that field for a distance of approximately 375 metres to its south-eastern corner and then in a generally westerly direction along Pye's Lane for approximately 325 metres to the south-western corner of O.S. F.P.14	Connects Hall Lane (B1113) with Wash Lane and consists of: (a) a footpath known as Doe's Walk, from the shrubbery corner on B1113 to the East end of Half-Moon Road. This path is shown as public footpath and Church Path and designated public footpath No. 1 in 1818 Award; (b) a stone metalled cart road running eastwards to a point opposite the north-western corner of O.S. Field No. 4669. This is shown as Pye's Lane in the 1818 Award. (c) a footpath running from a point on Pye's Lane opposite the north-western corner of O.S. Field No. 4669 in a southerly direction for approximately 50 metres to the south-western corner of O.S. Field No. 4669 and then in an easterly direction along the southern headlands of O.S. Field Nos. 4669, 7100, 0073 and 5400 for a distance of approximately 1 metres to the south-eastern corner of O.S. Field No. 5400 and then in a northerly direction glong the eastern headland of O.S. Field No. 5400 for a distance of approximately 50 metres to the junction of O.S. Field No. 5400 with Wash Lane. Width of third section - 1.2 metres.
F.P.15	Runs from Redgrave Green towards the Back Hills in Botesdale and consists of : (a) A stone metalled road called the 14th private road in 1818 Award. (b) A footpath called Drom Lane in the 1818 Award, running south, crossing Lizzie's Lane (No. 17) to the footbridge marked on the map.
F.P.16	Called the Alley, connecting Half-Moon Street with Church Road.
F.P.17	Known in part as Lizzie's Lane. From Kare Lane (B1113) in a general north-westerly direction along a succession of meadows south of Butts Plantation, along the eastern edge of the Russian Plantation to join path No. 20 near Ladies Bridge. This system, known in past as Lizzie's Lane, connects the Hall Lane (B1113) with the easternmost corner of the parish of Hinderclay.
F.P.18	From path No. 17 at Butts Plantation westwards to the parish boundary with Rickinghall Inferior.
F.P.19 -C. 20 7.88 .8.89	Connecting Redgrave Green with Hinderclay, consisting of: (a) A lane shown as the 13th private road in the 1818 Award from Green Farm eastwards to Redgrave Green. (b) A footpath and cart track crossing meadow and field to the west of Green Farm to the junction with Footpath No. 1. To the west of Footpath 1 the path continues in a westerly direction crossing three fields and lying successively to the south, the north, and the south of a line of east-west fences. To the west of Footpath 20 where it is here known as the 4th public footpath in the 1818 Award, it crosses a meadow to the footbridge leading across a stream into the parish of Hinderclay.
F.P.20	A green lane from path No. 19 to the unclassified road west of Crackthorn Bridge shown as Southern Lane on the 6" map, but as South Fen Lane (being the 9th Private Road) in the 1818 Award. The lane deteriorates into a footpath by the meadow on which it joins 19.
F.P.21	Connecting Redgrave Street with the middle of Footpath 1 running across two Glebe meadows from opposite the Hollies.
F.P.22	This short length connects Redgrave Green with 81113 and consists of : (a) A footpath at the south-western corner of the copse at Redgrave Green. (b) That part of the driveway leading from B1113 to the cottage which lies within the above- mentioned copse.
